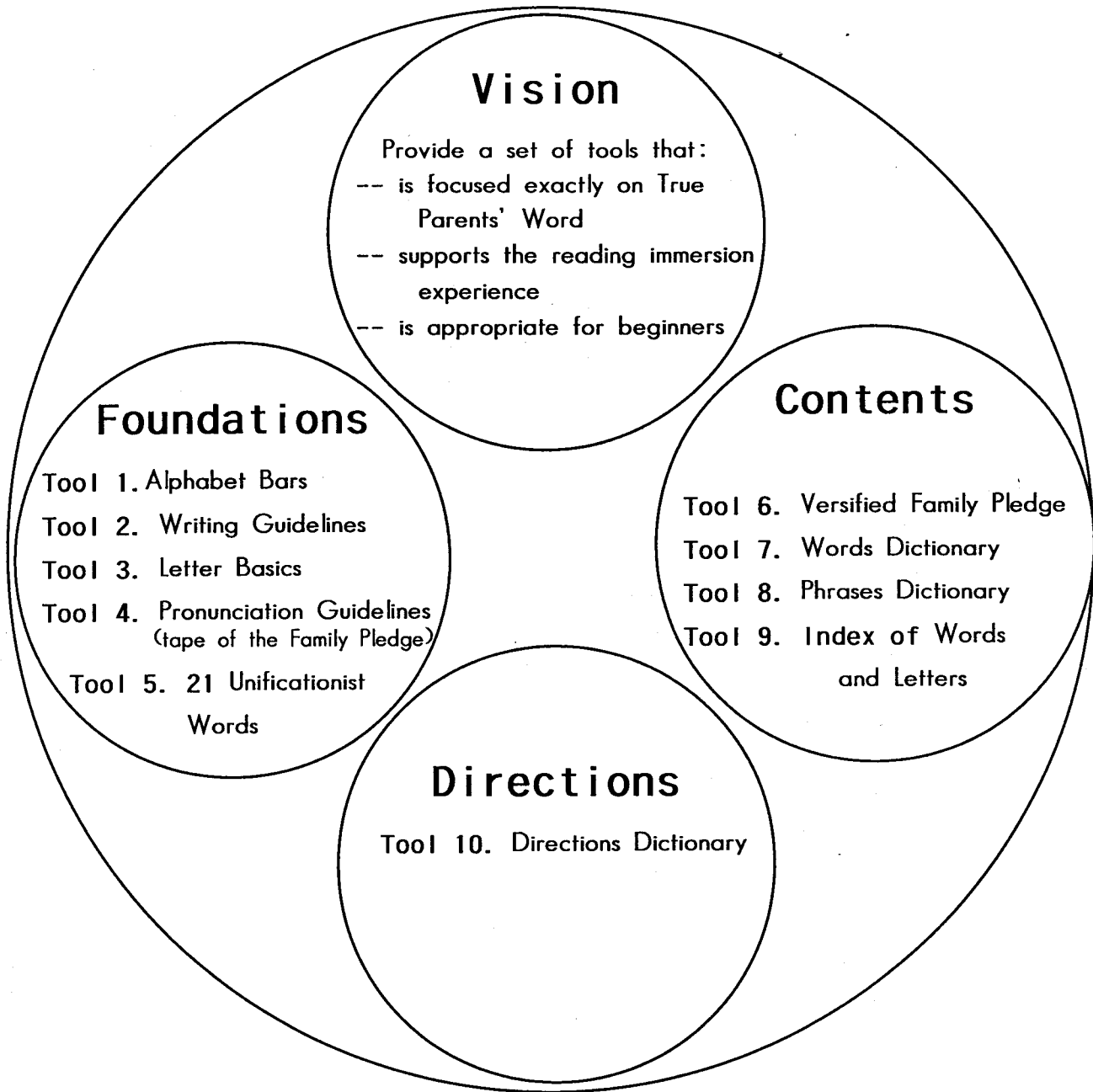

# Explaining the 10 TOOLS

Remember the tasks of reading immersion:

- \*\*read it aloud
- \*\*write it
- \*\*look it up in a dictionary
- \*\*scan for it in a block of text

You will perform these tasks by using the 10 TOOLS in the beginner's toolkit, which is divided into 3 compartments labeled as: FOUNDATIONS, CONTENTS, and DIRECTIONS.

The FOUNDATIONS compartment holds 5 tools:

**Tool 1. Alphabet Bars**--These show you all letters in alphabetical order.

Alphabet bars accompany each letter as it is introduced as the featured letter.

**Tool 2. Writing Guidelines**--Writing Korean is essential for performing the exercises that immerse you in the language. Notice the differences between writing individual letters and writing syllables.

**Tool 3. Letter Basics**--Letter names in (1)Korean and (2)English give clues to pronunciation. You will memorize alphabetical order based on reciting the letter names as you complete the "Exercises for Getting to Know the Tools."

**Tool 4. Pronunciation Guidelines**--Essential for reading aloud. Includes Pronunciation Families, Pronunciation Analysis, and Pronunciation Examples. Find someone to help you learn pronunciation.

Study the **tape** with its 5 sections: (1)--In the Name of God; (2)--Memorize the Alphabet; (3)--21 Unificationist Words; (4)--Family Pledge 2002, with Cheon Il Guk; and (5)--Family Pledge 1997, an early version recited by Dr. Chang Shik Yang.

**Tool 5. 21 Unificationist Words**--These words contain all of the 33 letters used in the Family Pledge. The 33 letters are introduced one by one as a featured letter accompanied by a distinctive Unificationist photo or diagram.

The CONTENTS compartment holds 4 tools:

**Tool 6. Versified Family Pledge**--The reference text for Books 1 and 2 of the RTP Word series. In the versified version, each of the 8 verses is further subdivided (i.e., versified) into 3-6 clauses as an aid to identifying workable units of the text and for specifying word locations.

**Tool 7. Words Dictionary**--A customized dictionary whose contents are words from the Family Pledge and the 21 Unificationist Words, plus a few direction words.

**Tool 8. Phrases Dictionary**--A collection of selected phrases from the Family Pledge arranged alphabetically according to the first letter of the phrase.

**Tool 9. Index of Words and Letters**--Exercises in the lessons will require that you look up the locations of words and letters using this tool.

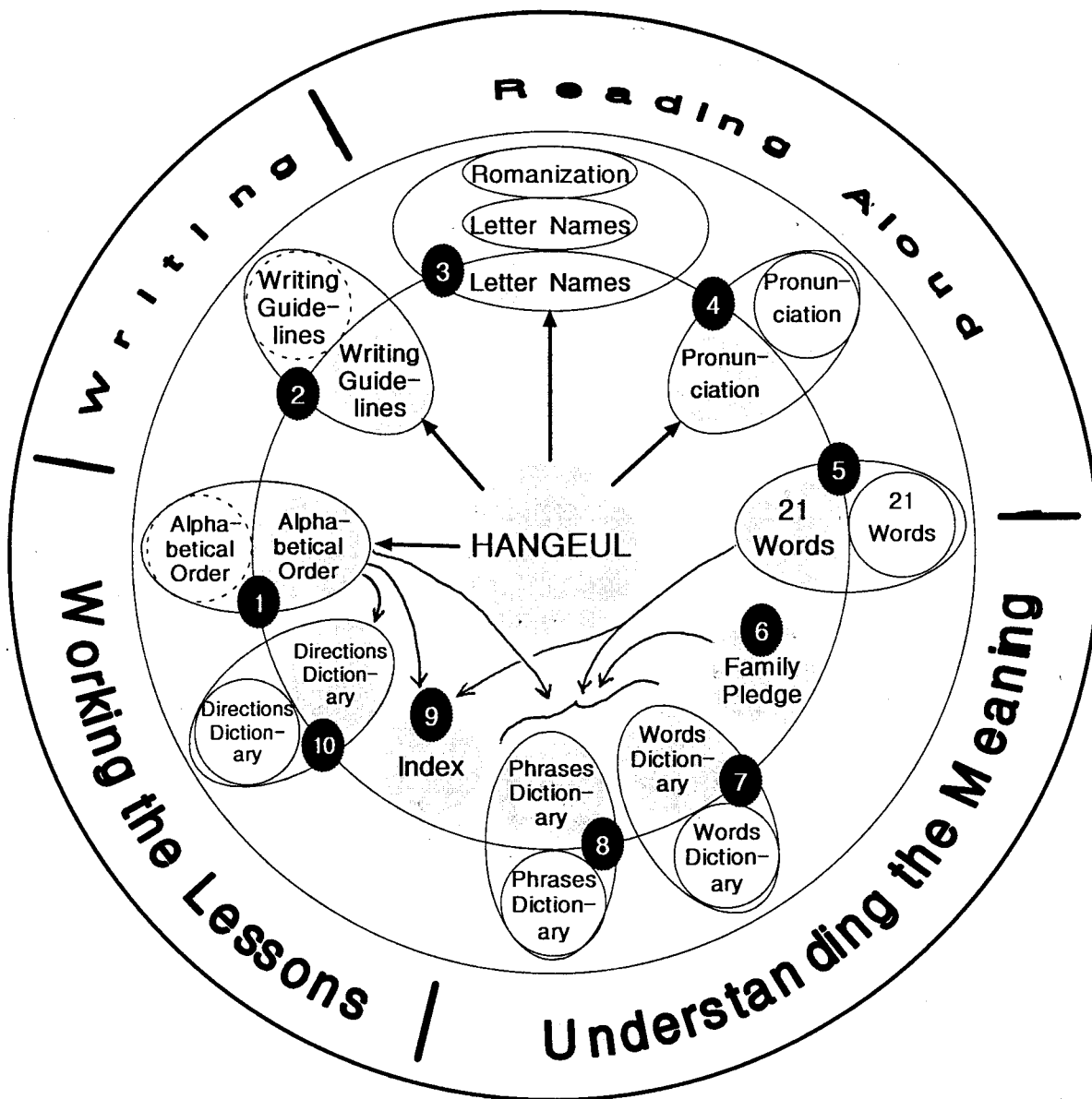
The DIRECTIONS compartment holds 1 tool:

**Tool 10. Directions Dictionary**--Directions given in the 10 LESSONS are in Korean. To figure out what you are supposed to do, you will need to look up the direction's meaning in Tool 10.

# 1. The 10 TOOLS Map ( ❶ = Tool 1 )



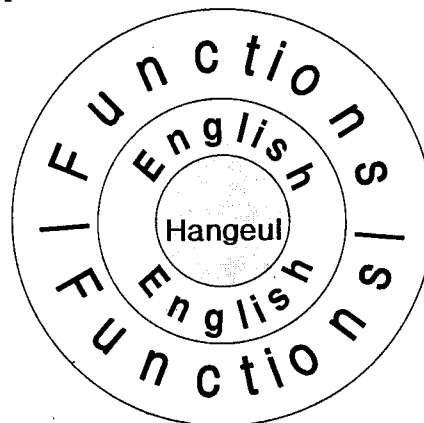
## Reading the Map

The 10 Tools Map organizes the 10 Tools according to *language used* and *function*. It separates language used into two concentric circles:

- \*\* Hangeul (Level 1) and
- \*\* English (Level 2).

[dashed circle = minor component]

In Level 3, four different **functions** are spread around the circle, providing useful categories for distinguishing the 10 Tools.

\*ROMANIZATION: (1) Examples: "Moon Sun Myung" or "Mun Seon Myeong" / "Chung Pyung" or "Cheong Pyeong" / "Chun Il Guk" or "Chun Il Gook" or "Cheon Il Guk"  
 (2) Discussion: For the English language, Romanization is the process of replacing the Korean alphabet with the English alphabet. Romanization Conventions can and do change. RTP word follows (mostly) those adopted by the Korean government in 2000.

**Assignment:** Give yourself a week, or a month, whatever time you need, to memorize the Alphabetical Order of the consonants and vowels.
